# BIOGRAPHY Diamond Jao ACKUMEY

he late Diamond Yao Ackumey was born in Kumasi, Ashanti Region, on 18th December 1947, to the late Moses Ackumey of Anyako and the late Elizabeth Wofewoli of Atiavi. He started school in Akwatia Elementary School and continued to a Normal technical school in Koforidua in the Eastern Region of Ghana.

Diamond relocated to Tema in the early 1970s to live with his father. He worked at Ghana Textile Manufacturing Company (GTMC). When an opportunity came for him to work in the shipping industry, he decided to further his education in marine operations. He obtained several certificates from Nautical College now Ghana Maritime University. His profession in marine activities started with Blackstar line as "deck hand" rising to an Assistant B. As a result of his hard work and talent, he was hired by Ben Shrell, a Dutch captain, travelling Australia, South Korea, Canada, USA, South Africa, Nigeria, Togo, Liberia, and Sierra Leone.

He went on to work on couple of other shipping companies. After this, he decided to explore entrepreneurship by setting up his own business, Diamondson Marine Works Company Limited, with the main office at Comm 4 Tema and a branch in Takoradi. Diamondson Marine Works Company Limited was subcontracted by some of the leading players in the shipping industry including Maersk Line.

He used Diamondson Marine Works Company Limited to give back to his community by employing the area youth particularly within Community 11 and Community 2.

He was a true family person who was interested in affairs of everyone in the extended family. He was noted for attending all family events including weddings, outdooring, and funerals. Diamond met his wife Comfort Ackumey in Akwatia in 1976 and they got married in 1977 traditionally. Their marriage was blessed on the 12th of May 1996 at the church of Pentecost Tema Community 12. Their marriage was blessed with 4 beautiful children. Two girls and two boys. Pearl, Kofi, Yaw, and Priscilla. By the grace of God, he was blessed with grandchildren.

Diamond was born into a Presbyterian home. He however accepted Christ once again in 1985 when an open crusade was held Infront of his house at Tema Community 11 by The Church of Pentecost.

Diamond was completely intoxicated on that night but God through his mysterious act, snatched him on the day and he never turned back. Despite busy family and work schedules, he was an active member of the church. He was a key contributor to the great commission evangelistic movement set up under Apostle Koduah, through which he and other faithfuls spearheaded the establishment of several green field churches within the original Tema area. He was one of the founding officers for New Jerusalem assembly, in the then Tema Area. He was called into the office of a deacon and later an elder in The Church of Pentecost. He served in several assembly's, including the Tema Community 12

assembly, New Jerusalem Assembly, Blessed Assembly, Community 9 assembly. The last assembly he worshipped was the Dunamis English Assembly, Comm 12, as one of the founding officers. He was a very active in the Missions work of the church and embarked on several missions and was active at all crusades where he joined the team on evangelism.

He was noted for punctuality at church. Diamond was very punctual at all events and respected time, he loved people and demonstrated love to all.

We will be remiss if we do not share


